NOTES FROM THE OFFICE

Principal's Message

I am SO excited to announce that Cherry Creek Elementary has adopted the Leader In Me program and that we have already begun to introduce the language to our students. Right now, we are simply trying to teach the students the 7 Habits and encourage them to apply some simple principles to their daily lives. This is the first step! For your convenience, here is a list of the habits and some simple definitions.

- **Habit 1- Be Proactive-** You're in charge. I am a responsible person. I take initiative. I choose my actions, attitudes, and moods. I do not blame others for my wrong actions. I do the right thing without being asked, even when no one is looking.
- Habit 2- Begin with the End in Mind- Have a plan. I plan ahead and set goals. I do things that have meaning and make a difference. I am an important part of my classroom and contribute to my school's mission and vision. I look for ways to be a good citizen.
- Habit 3- Put First Things First- Work first, then play. I spend my time on things that are most important. This means I say no to things I know I should not do. I set priorities, make a schedule, and follow my plan. I am disciplined and organized.
- Habit 4- Think Win-Win- Everyone can win. I balance courage for getting what I want with consideration for what others want. I make deposits in others' Emotional Bank Accounts. When conflicts arise, I look for Third Alternatives.
- Habit 5- Seek First to Understand then to be Understood- Listen before you talk. I listen to other people's ideas and feelings. I try to see things from their viewpoints. I listen to others without interrupting. I am confident in voicing my ideas. I look people in the eyes when talking.
- Habit 6- Synergize- Together is better! I value other people's strengths and learn from them. I get along well with others, even people who are different from me. I work well in groups. I seek out other people's ideas to solve problems because I know that by teaming with others, we can create better solutions than anyone of us can alone. I am humble.
- Habit 7- Sharpen the Saw- Balance feels best. I take care of my body by eating right, exercising, and getting sleep. I spend time with family and friends. I learn in lots of ways and lots of places, not just at school. I find meaningful ways to help others.

Please discuss these habits with your children and as a family. The habits will mean so much more to them if they become a part of their home. Also, you will probably notice an increase in student leadership opportunities. We want our students to be leaders and it is our job to give them the opportunity to lead. Teeth Varnishing

Wednesday, September 24TH

Oral health is the number one need identified by the Utah County Health Department nurses who work with the children in Utah County schools. Utah is a state with minimal water fluoridation, and the rate of dental caries, or tooth decay, is relatively high. Utah County has one of the highest incidences of dental caries in the state. Each year, Intermountain Healthcare, Community Health Connect, the Utah County School Nurses, and volunteers from Brigham Young University, Utah Valley University and the MATC Dental Assisting Program work to improve the oral health of elementary school students in our valley. This free dental campaign provides a dental kit to each student including a toothbrush and toothpaste. These kits ensure that each child has the necessary tools to care for their teeth and use the skills they learned from the program volunteers. All children having prior parental consent are then given an application of fluoride varnish. This FDA approved treatment is simply painted onto the teeth and helps prevent cavities from occurring. It is free, quick, and painless. While varnishing teeth, student's oral health is assessed and children without dental insurance who require further assistance are referred to Community Health Connect, where if they qualify, are linked with a volunteer dentist. If you want to participate in this program, watch for a permission slip and informative flyer being sent home with your student this fall.
